- **Bridges**: Replace missing teeth by anchoring/attaching artificial teeth to adjacent crowns.
- **Implants**: Titanium posts/screws surgically placed in the jawbone, topped with a crown. A **Dental Implant Specialist Warriewood** typically handles this phase.

Crowns are preferred when the tooth's structure is compromised beyond what veneers can address.

a. Initial Consultation

- Impressions of your tooth are taken digitally or with moulds sent to a lab where your dental crowns and bridges are custom-made.
- A temporary crown is carefully placed to protect the tooth for 2–3 weeks.

d. Crown Fabrication

Labs craft crowns from materials chosen during your consultation (e.g., porcelain for a natural look, metal for durability).

e. Final Placement

- The temporary crown is removed.
- The permanent dental crown is adjusted for fit and bite and then cemented into place.
