
Don't Ignore These Signs: How to Know If You Need Emergency Dental Services for a Cracked Tooth



Cracked teeth are a common dental issue that can range from simple cosmetic concerns to serious oral health problems. However, identifying a cracked tooth isn't always straightforward, as symptoms may be subtle or intermittent.

Common Signs of a Cracked Tooth

Pain When Chewing or Biting

A sharp, sudden pain when eating, especially with hard or crunchy foods, is a hallmark symptom. The discomfort may disappear when pressure is removed, making it easy to ignore. However, recurring pain should never be overlooked.

Temperature Sensitivity

Sensitivity to hot or cold foods/drinks, even after they're removed, could indicate a crack exposing the tooth's inner layers or nerves.

Intermittent Discomfort

Unlike a constant toothache from decay, cracked tooth pain often comes and goes. This unpredictability can make self-diagnosis tricky. A dentist at Northern Beaches can take a close look and make an appropriate diagnosis.

Swollen Gums

Cracks near the gum line may irritate surrounding tissues, leading to localised swelling or tenderness.

Visible Damage

Not all dental cracks are visible to the naked eye, but larger ones may appear as lines or fractures. Shine a light on your tooth or check for irregularities in a mirror.

Types of Tooth Cracks

- **Craze Lines**: Superficial cracks in the enamel, often harmless and requiring no treatment.
- Fractured Cusp: A break in the chewing surface, usually around a filling.
- **Split Tooth**: A vertical crack extending from the crown to the root, often requiring extraction.
- **Vertical Root Fracture**: A crack starting at the root, which may only show symptoms once an infection develops.

When to Seek Emergency Dental Services?

While minor cracks might wait for a routine check-up, certain symptoms demand immediate care from emergency dental services:

- Severe, unrelenting pain
- Swelling in the face or gums
- A loose tooth
- Signs of infection (e.g., fever, pus)

How a Dentist Diagnoses a Cracked Tooth?

A dentist Northern Beaches will use several methods to identify cracks:

- Visual Examination: Checking for visible fractures or damaged restorations.
- Dye Tests: Using special dyes to highlight subtle cracks.
- X-rays: While not all cracks show up on X-rays, they help rule out decay or abscesses.
- **Bite Tests**: Applying pressure to pinpoint the crack's location.

Treatment Options for a Cracked Tooth

The right treatment depends on the crack's location, depth, and severity:

Dental Bonding or Veneers

For minor cracks or cosmetic concerns, dental veneers can restore the tooth's appearance. These thin porcelain shells cover imperfections and protect the enamel.

Root Canal Treatment

If the crack reaches the pulp (the tooth's nerve centre), a **Root Canal Treatment** may be required to remove infected tissue and seal the tooth. This saves the natural tooth and prevents extraction.

Dental Crowns

A crown is often placed by your dentist after a root canal to reinforce the tooth's structure.

Extraction

Severely split teeth may require removal, followed by options like implants or bridges.

Preventing Cracked Teeth

While accidents happen, you can reduce your risk by:

- Avoid chewing ice, hard candies, or non-food items (e.g., pens).
- Wearing a mouthguard during sports.
- Treating bruxism (teeth grinding) with a nightguard.
- Visiting the dentist in the Northern Beaches regularly for check-ups.
